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Summer Learning Loss

The A.C.E.S. program will help students sharpen their skills both academically and socially, that are typically lost during the summer. This will better prepare them for success in the next grade level. Statistics show:

- Lower income students start Kindergarten 6 months behind
- Lower income students fall behind 2 months over the summer between Kindergarten and grade 1
- Lower income students are 2.5-3 years behind by the end of 5th grade
